PHYSICAL EDUCATION WAIVERS

Dance Waiver

- 1 Semester of Dance = 1 Semester Other PE
- Must also complete 1 Semester of Personal Fitness via PVS or FLVS

ROTC Waiver

- 2 Years of ROTC = 1 Year of HOPE
- Must also complete an Online Learning Course to satisfy virtual requirement

Interscholastic Athletic Participation

- Student athletes who have participated in an interscholastic sport at the junior varsity or varsity level for two full seasons
- Interscholastic Athletic Participation Acknowledgement Form must be completed and signed by the Athletic Director prior to being submitted to the School Counselor for credit to be posted

Your School Counselor will approve the course



May select Polk Virtual School (PVS) or Florida Virtual School (FLVS) PVS = places students on track for completion with PCPS calendar

FLVS = places students throughout the year



After School Counselor approval, PVS/FLVS will assign a teacher. FLVS may take a few weeks. PVS may take only a few days.



Continue to check your FLVS account for placement.

Requirements for Harrison diploma

- > 10 program credits if entered in 9th grade
- > 8 program credits if entered in 10th grade
- ➤ Weighted GPA of 2.3

Passing scores required:

- Grade 10 FSA (Florida Standards Assessment)
- ► Algebra 1 EOC

In subject's requiring an EOC, the EOC counts for 30% of the final grade

PSAT

- PSAT is administered October 13th.
- Juniors must register for PSAT listen for announcements/Remind notification
- PSAT Math score of 430 is Algebra 1 EOC concordant score.
- PSAT scores junior year are used for National Merit Scholars Program eligibility
- PSAT results may be used as SAT prep

ACADEMIC PROBATION


Students earning a semester weighted GPA below 2.3 are placed on academic probation.

Students must bring their weighted GPA up to 2.3 the following semester in order to remain enrolled at Harrison.

Students who do not achieve a GPA of 2.3 for two semesters in a row will be released from Harrison to return to their zoned school.

A failing semester grade in a Harrison course is grounds for immediate dismissal.

- EOC courses letter grade posted for both semesters after EOC results are calculated in at 30%

Permanent Records

- ½ Credit posted each SEMESTER (1 & 2)
- Credits earned impact cumulative GPA

Florida Graduation Requirements are <u>minimum</u> expectations for a standard diploma

Harrison requirements are 10 arts-based credits

Scholarships

- Course rigor, community service, grades earned
- Need-based and Merit-based

STATE UNIVERSITY SYSTEM (SUS)

To qualify to enter one of Florida's public universities, a first time-in-college (FTIC) student must meet the following minimum requirements:


- High school graduation with a standard diploma
- Admission test scores (SAT/ACT)
- 16 credits of approved college preparatory academic courses
 - 4 English (3 with substantial writing)
 - 4 Mathematics (Algebra I level and above)
 - 3 Natural Science (2 with substantial lab)
 - 3 Social Science
 - 2 World Language (sequential, in the same language)
 - 2 approved electives







ELIGIBILITY



Students must have a minimum of six (6) core credits in order to be approved to dual enroll



Students must have an unweighted 3.0 GPA and pass PERT in the subject area for academic subjects



Students should complete English 2, Algebra 2, Biology and Chemistry before pursuing college level English, Math or Science courses.



Part-time dual enrolled students take up to 3 classes per semester in addition to their Harrison and LHS classes



Full Time Early admission is not an option for Harrison students

Record

Write down assignments daily

Take notes in class by identifying the main points, write down examples



Reduce

After class <u>summarize</u> what you have written down/learned

Key/cue words, phrases, questions you may have for the teacher



Recite - Talk Aloud

Review from memory what you have learned – create examples



Reflect - Think it over

How is this relevant to what you have learned before?




Review – The notes you took

Make it a daily practice Flash cards – they are portable, quick, and effective


